





After the retirement of Rabbis Smith and Katz, I decided it was my time to retire as well. About a year ago, I submitted my letter to our past Chairman, Stephen Garfinkel, and after working out the details, we came to an agreement that my last working day for EHRS will be April 4 of this year.

In short, younger leaders with new and different ideas and talents which we have in Rabbis Mark Goldsmith as well as Emily Reitsma-Jurman and now Debbie Young-Somers.

EHRS will always be a part of my life. You are the community I have served the longest. We have shared memories of Holy Days and life cycle events. We have grown up and we have grown older together. We have faced times of sorrow as I have officiated at the funerals of too many people who were dear friends, and there have been times when we have celebrated and laughed together. There are young people whom I named, and

there are others whose B'nai Mitzvah I conducted, those who have studied for conversion at whose Admission Ceremonies I have officiated, and the many weddings it has been my privilege to perform. I cannot say farewell to those memories and people; they will live on.

You have honoured me by allowing me to be part of your lives, and for that I will always be grateful. You have always cared for me as I have tried to care for you...

One thing I have learned and believe is that the power of our community is found in us. It is in our relationships to one another. It is in the meaning we find in embracing our neighbours and turning them into our friends. It is in the power we find in giving the gift of Torah and community to our children and to our children's children. It is in the work we do together to transform our world through our shared commitment to a life of learning, worship, and acts of loving kindness. It is about building a community of tradition and faith.

There are many people I want to thank for helping me over the years; too many to name but I hope you know who you are.

Thank you to everyone with whom I have worked, past and present. Thank you to those individuals who have given their time and energy serving on various committees and Council. And thank all of you for your dedication and devotion to EHRS.

I also want to thank my family. The Shul may have hired me, but my family has been, and remains an essential part of my rabbinate. Without Susannah, nothing would have been possible. I am blessed to have an amazing wife who not only loves and supports me unconditionally, but also knows when to hit me over the head and say "Stop, think about what you are doing!" Susannah has reviewed virtually every sermon I have ever delivered, and every article I have written, making them better. Sometimes I actually listened to what she has to say!

I also want to thank my children, Elie and Oscar. You have put up with so much: my long hours, often absent from the house and the intense situations that I brought home too often. I hope you will live lives committed to our tradition; not because I am a rabbi, but because you are proud to be Jews. In the end that is what matters to me!

I have tried to live my life through a verse expressed in Psalm 100: "Ivdu et Adonai b' simcha... Worship God with joy." For me, joy in Jewish living is the key, particularly if we want to see it passed on to future generations...

I cannot sum up over 30 years in the rabbinate in a single article. But I want you to know how much serving our community has enriched my life, and my greatest joy would be to know that some of that emotion has spilled over to you during our 18 years together.

May our lives be filled with many moments of joy. And when times of sorrow fall upon us as they must, let us gather strength from the well springs of our faith and from each other.

May our future contain many blessings of health, joy, goodness and everything that we wish for ourselves as individuals and as a community.

I don't like saying farewell. Susannah and I are grateful to the Synagogue for the gift of life membership and so you will still see us. I am especially grateful to the Honorary officers and Council who have honoured me with the title of Rabbi Emeritus, joining my dear colleagues Rabbis Danny Smith and Steven Katz.

As for the future, I don't know what I will do. Now there is no excuse of work to prevent me from finally cleaning up my study! I look forward to reading all the books I should have read over the years, to study for the pure pleasure of study, to do some volunteer work, watch some rubbish telly and who knows what else? I do believe that often when we think we're at the end of something, we're really at the beginning of something new.

Wherever our journeys take us, may God go with us; and may we all be worthy of God's many blessings and the friendships we have formed over the years.

THE HOUSE OF LIFE

Willesden's Historic Jewish Cemetery



About three years ago I read a letter in the Jewish Chronicle seeking volunteers for a project being prepared by the United Synagogue for the restoration of the Willesden (U.S.) Cemetery. This involved seeking a grant of nearly two million pounds from the Heritage Lottery Fund. My wife and I grew up in Willesden and we registered our interest and have since become very involved as volunteers. Many members of EHRS may also have family connections with the area and family buried there.

The cemetery is now in the process of being restored and the lodge and a new extension are being established as a cultural, educational and reference centre detailing the life of the Jewish community and its contribution to this Country. Tours are now regularly held highlighting some of the many people buried here and taking some of these is one of the contributions that we make. A program of talks is also planned for the new year.

Willesden is an amazing historic example of a Victorian Cemetery which opened, in 1873, following the creation of the United Synagogue and quickly became the "go to" place for burial of the rich and famous of Victorian British Jewry. It now has Parks Grade 2 listed status.

Much of the funding for the purchase of the land came from four families, the Rothschilds, Beddingtons, Montague's and Waley Cohens. Originally an eight acre site the land was purchased from All Souls College Oxford and expanded several times over the next forty or so years to its present size. The funerary buildings are English mock Gothic in their architecture and many of the graves in the older sections follow the style of Christian cemeteries illustrating the desires of many families to show assimilation into British culture following their immigration from Europe. In its early days there were greenhouses and gardeners working at the cemetery providing flowers for both the graves and the gardens. This came to an end with the great war when many of the gardeners joined up to fight.

There are approximately 29,600 graves in the cemetery and space for possibly a further 200 burials for those who have reserved plots in what is now a closed cemetery for further burials. Possibly some of these reserved plots will never be taken up as people have moved far away or left the U.S. organization. Burials here are a history of the contributions made to Britain by both nineteenth and twentieth century Jewry. Among nineteenth century burials are those of many of the Rothschilds one of whom loaned the government four million pounds to purchase the Suez Canal before a deadline expired. The Barnato family plot is here and the De Beers



Diamond Company came about partly from their exploits. Twentieth century burials include Rosalind Franklin brilliant scientist and discoverer of DNA, the bandleader Geraldo, film director and raconteur Michael Winner, Tesco's founder Sir John Cohen and many more. Religious and community leaders are in abundance as are scientists, politicians, artists, lawyers, businessmen and community leaders etc.


The first Jewish war memorial in Britain is also located near to the cemetery entrance and an AJEX remembrance service is held annually. There are also commonwealth war graves and memorials to several hundred Jewish servicemen who gave their lives in both world wars and other conflicts, there are of course many in other Jewish and CWG cemeteries. An interesting fact is that in the first world war a higher percentage of Jewish volunteers gave their lives compared to other British volunteers!


