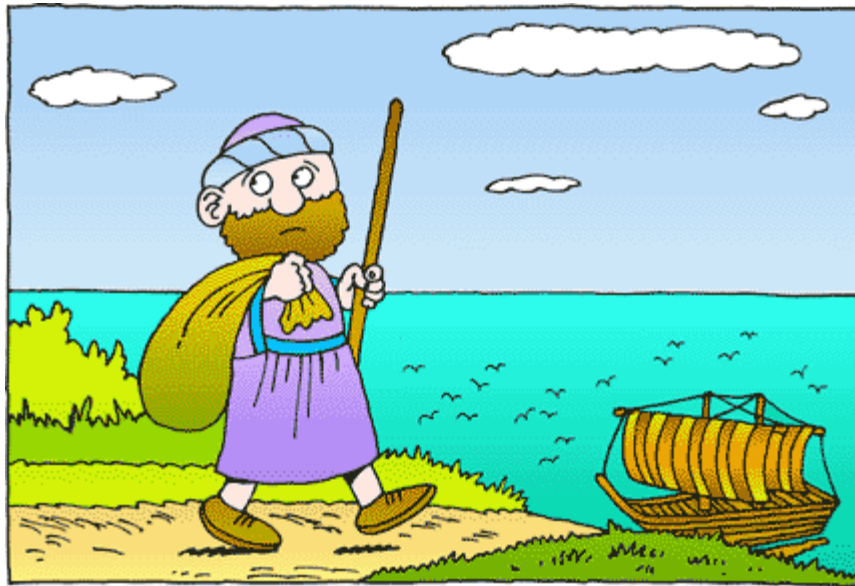


Blessing after reading the Haftarah

God said to Jonah: Go to the city of Nineveh and tell the people to stop being mean to each other.

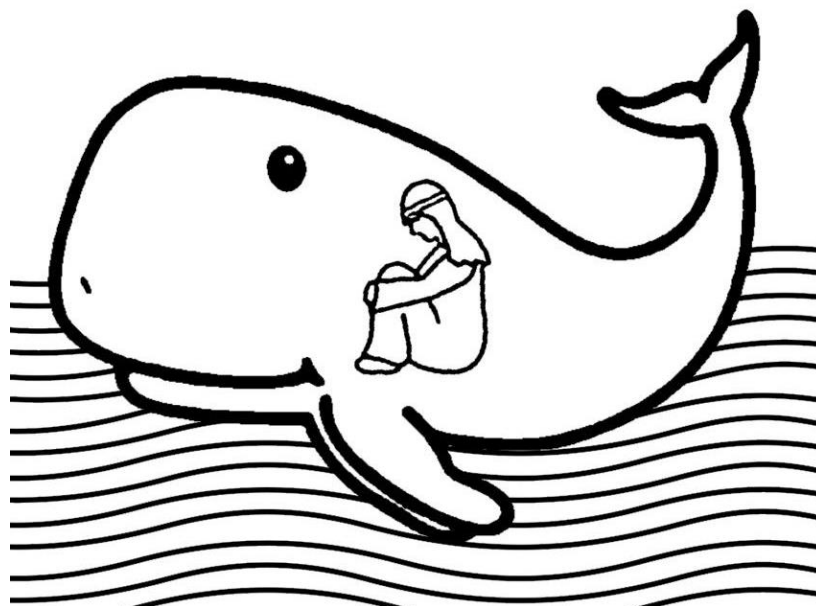
Jonah said: No I won't. It's too hard for me to do this. I am going to get on a boat and go as far away as I can from Nineveh!

The whale let Jonah walk out of her mouth on the beach near Nineveh.

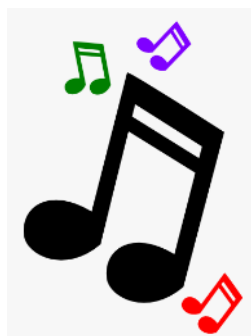
Jonah sang this song to the people of Nineveh – and they all learned how to be good friends to each other, and not to be mean anymore!
