#### WALK IN THEIR SHOES - YOU KNOW THE HEART OF A STRANGER



Jews know the pain of displacement, of losing your home, of being under threat and yet holding fast to your identity and your values. Maybe this is why the Jewish community as a whole and we here at EHRS have responded in such a heartfelt way to the plight of the people of Ukraine, led by their President Volodymyr Zelensky, himself of Jewish family origin.

Many households in our community have responded to the appeal from Refugees at Home and World Jewish Relief for hosts for Ukrainian refugees, if and when our government enables them to come to the UK to find safety. We shared a Friday Night Lights service with Reform Rabbi Alex Dukhovny, speaking to us from a bomb shelter basement in Kyiv and we have been regularly in contact with Rabbi Julia Gris from our twin community in Odessa as she had to flee the country and then work to keep the community together and help them to support each other from safety in Warsaw and now in Germany. We gave generously to the appeals for money to enable humanitarian and community work in Ukraine and the countries to which Ukrainian refugees have fled, from World Jewish Relief (WJR) and the World Union for Progressive Judaism (WUPJ) as help on the ground is the best help.

This article has to be written in early April and we cannot know where Ukraine will be by the time this edition of LeDor VaDor is distributed, but we know that whatever is happening we will be praying as we have in Shul every Shabbat that 'peace will come soon and that the work of rebuilding all that has been lost will begin'. As our prayer says every week, 'We will be with you, alongside you, to take part in that holy work.'

Ever since Putin's invasion of Ukraine on 24 February there has, despite all this, been a sense of helplessness that there is so little we can do from London to make a difference. That is why our event on the first Sunday in April, 'Walk and Hour in Their Shoes' felt so powerful. Nearly fifty members of EHRS from eight years of age to members well into the eighties completed a sponsored walk carrying banners made by the children of Orot.



We were tooted in support by many people driving by and when we paused at our half way mark we heard live from Rabbi Tanya Sakhnovitch, in Warsaw, supporting Ukrainian refugees who have made it to the Ec Chayim Reform Synagogue in the city. Rabbi Tanya told us of how she and her family had escaped from Kyiv to Poland in the early days of the conflict. We returned to EHRS to enjoy Ukrainian foods and to celebrate that this walk had raised more than £1000 for the WJR and WUPJ appeals.

We will keep this support coming. You will see in this edition that we plan a supper quiz, in aid of the appeals, on 22 May. If our families do begin to host refugees we will ensure that EHRS becomes an extension of the homes in which they are being hosted. Already Nagila, our Kindergarten, is expecting a Ukrainian child to join them learning here. We will play our part in the restoration of the strong Reform Jewish and other Jewish communities in Ukraine. We will show that we walk in the same shoes and that we know each other's hearts.





Please find below a summary of the recent events from the Board of Deputies:

 Herts Jewish Forum met with the Leader of Hertsmere Council, and discussed matters of Cohesion, Recovery and Housing Development.
 The Board, with London Jewish Forum (LJF), Jewish Care, JAMI and the Borough of Barnet, continue to work on a Bereavement Signposting Guide.



- The Board joined a meeting of the Metropolitan Police London Jewish Forum to discuss topics including an update on progress on the Metropolitan Police Rebuilding Trust Plan; a briefing on current approaches to tackling hate crime and a briefing from the CPS on identifying, flagging and prosecuting antisemitism. The Board met senior staff at Unison and GMB to discuss confronting antisemitism.
- LJF with the Board and JLC are planning in-person hustings in Barnet (Edgware United, JCoSS, FRS and Ner Yisrael), in Enfield (CNSS), in Haringey (MHS), in Camden (JW3). In the run up to local elections in May, LJF have been meeting and briefing new Jewish council candidates including in Harrow, Hackney, Merton, Waltham Forest, Camden and Barnet. There are many new Jewish candidates standing.
- The Board met the Vice Chancellor at Sheffield Hallam University to discuss issues relating to a member of the faculty and concerns of antisemitism on campus that are affecting the well-being and safety of Jewish students and staff.
- The Board met Austrian Ambassador Michael Zimmermann. They spoke about Austria's continued commitment to fighting
  antisemitism, advocating for fair treatment of Israel and the ongoing crisis in Ukraine. In Budapest the Board held a series of
  meetings, including with our Hungarian sister community, Mazsihisz, The Federation of Hungarian Jewish Communities, the
  Director of the Budapest JCC and colleagues from the World Jewish Congress Budapest office. Amongst topics discussed was
  the relationship between the communities, best practice for combatting antisemitism and the rejuvenation of Jewish life in
  Hungary.
