

Elul

Elul is our month of preparation to get us ready for the spiritual work of the High Holy Days. This year there will be a series of preparatory workshops with our Rabbis.

Selichot Choral Service & Film - Saturday 17 September, 20:30-00:10

Erev Rosh Hashanah - Sunday 25 September

First Day Rosh Hashanah - Monday 26 September

We will hold an early Kitzur (Shortened) Shacharit and Musaf (Additional) Service at 8:30, and a Shacharit & Musaf (Additional) Service, at 10:30. We also have an Early Years Service, Primary Years Service, and a Youth Service running parallel. From 17:00-17:30 we will have our Tashlich in the Park in various local locations.

Second Day Rosh Hashanah - Tuesday 27 September

Our morning Shacharit and Musaf Service will take place at 10:30 with a parallel study session Bite of Apple & Honey Torah Study, Earth's Birthday Family Service, and Earth's Birthday Youth Activities.

Kol Nidre - Tuesday 4 October (Fast Begins 18:17)

Our Kol Nidre Service will begin at 19:00, and we will have a Chill Nidre, for young people aged 11+. We will also have a study session on this evening, How does Yom Kippur work when you are not sure about God?

Yom Kippur - Wednesday 5 October (Fast ends 19:16)

Throughout the day on Yom Kippur, you will have the choice of our classic services such as Shacharit, Musaf, Minchah, Yizkor and Neilah, as well as a variety of parallel adult study sessions such as Yom Kippur B'Bayit, Neshamah Avodah, No Beer Still a Shiur and Talmud study session. We also have many young children and youth services on offer. The day will end with Havdallah.

Sukkot - Sunday 9 - Monday 10 October

Rabbi Tabick will be supporting us during the coming High Holy Days, and I wish her well with that. Moving forward we have been fortunate to secure Rabbi Tanya Sakhnovitch on a one year contract from this November until after next year's High Holy Days, while we start another recruitment process for a permanent third rabbi. Rabbi Tanya has worked with Rabbis Mark and Debbie before, and they are looking forward to renewing that relationship.

Talking of Rabbis Mark and Debbie, I want to thank them for their constant support, hard work and effort during this year. I know it has not been easy for them being only two instead of three, and I really appreciate all they have done and are continuing to do to move this community forward.

This is my last message to you as Chairman of EHRS as I will be stepping down after 40 months, at the coming AGM on Sunday 16 October. Due to the pandemic, it has not been the chairmanship I thought it would be, but has been challenging in different ways. I want to thank all those volunteers, too numerous to mention, for their support. I also want to thank the admin staff, particularly Perry and Martine, for their help and guidance, the caretaking staff, our wonderful choir, wardens, tech team, youth and teaching staff, and of course, our Rabbis, for making this time so special for me. If I have left anybody out, it is not intentional, and I hope you will forgive me. I believe EHRS is a muchchanged place from the shul I took over - I hope the changes are for the better for our future. I just wanted to say it has been a real and genuine privilege to be your chairman during this time. Wishing you a healthy and happy new year.

Life-saving research at Hadassah



Hadassah researchers have discovered the reason behind recurrent life-threatening infections in infants that lead to bone marrow failure. A young Palestinian girl with a serious blood disorder, Thalassemia Major, received a bone marrow transplantation at Hadassah and was cured of this debilitating disease.

During the first Covid-19 lockdown, Hadassah located a bone marrow donor from Germany urgently needed to save the life of a six-month-old boy in Jerusalem. The baby has a deadly disease called Juvenile Osteoporosis, where the bones become solidified, causing blindness and deafness.

Hadassah Emergency Medical Mission on the ground

Hadassah Hospital sent two teams together with medical supplies at the start of the Ukrainian war, to Lublin Hospital near the Polish/Ukrainian border and a forward base at Przemysl on the border crossing point. The teams assessed the medical needs of the Ukrainian refugees and helped train the Polish medical teams in mass casualty triage & A&E. The two delegations brought with them an intimate knowledge of wartime and disaster relief medicine and the physical and human infrastructure needed to handle sudden large mass influxes of patients.



Some of our students said that they want to learn more Hebrew, and one said they would like to learn script, which is useful, if they go to Jewish school. One suggestion that came up several times was to have some organised games during the break to offer an opportunity for the children to make new friends. We will definitely be doing that.

In Jewish Studies, we have projects, this year we looked at the 'History of the Jews of England'. We learnt about the harsh life for Jews in past centuries, how they were expelled from England and brought back at the time of Oliver Cromwell, and were then able to practice their faith openly! To enhance this project we visited the Jewish Museum and the Jewish East End with Rabbi Mark. We also learnt about 'Animals in the Torah'. We were looking at all things animal and what our responsibilities are as Jews. For example: When God gave us



dominion over the animals what did we do with it? How we interact with animals now and what the Torah says we must do. Are the mitzvot related to the welfare/eating of animals valid now? A visit to Aldenham Farm was a fun way to see some of the animals mentioned in Torah. Our third project was looking at bible stories included within the Torah, focussing on major characters and personalities such as Adam and Eve, Abraham, Joseph and Moses.

When asked what the best event of the year was, nearly all cited the joint activities that we did with Young Families and the community. The Shavuot activity morning was particularly popular. Our next joint activity will be the Sukkah Decorating Party on Sunday 9 October, see page 7 for details.



For many years EHRS and its two original constituent Synagogues have enabled the children of a Jewish father whose mother is not Jewish to convert to Judaism through the MRJ Beit Din at any age up to 16, based on their Jewish upbringing and the commitment of both parents that this will continue until adulthood.

In 2015 the MRJ Beit Din introduced an additional procedure to enable a child with one Jewish parent's Jewish status to be recognised.

This is called Inherited Status. Jewish status certified in this way is accepted by most Reform and Liberal Synagogues worldwide. It also enables the children of a Jewish father whose mother is not Jewish to be accepted as Jews for all purposes, including b'nei mitzvah and marriage, by virtue of their Jewish upbringing as defined by the Beit Din. It is not called conversion as the child has not been part of a different religion and has lived within the Jewish community.

At the June 2022 EHRS Council meeting our Synagogue committed to Inherited Status joining conversion as a route by which a child with one Jewish parent can have their Jewish Status fully recognised for all purposes. This followed a number of study sessions and shiurim taught by our Rabbis together with an open community forum in May.

The meaning of this is that any Jewish father who, with the other parent has decided to bring up their children as Jews is welcome to contact our Rabbis who will help their child to claim their Jewish status and be fully able to participate in the life of the global Reform and Liberal Jewish community. Rabbi Mark and Rabbi Debbie write: "It is truly a delight to help a young person claim their Jewish status where they have always lived as a Jew. To call it conversion can be insulting to the commitment their parents and they have made to their Jewish upbringing. As an inclusive and egalitarian Synagogue it makes complete sense that men and women are treated equally with respect to Jewish status."



Please find below a summary of the recent events from the Board of Deputies:

UK Education - To help educate non-Jewish school children and the wider public, details of the Jewish Living Experience Exhibition have been circulated to SACRE members by BoD. Expressions of interest have been made by several communities to host the exhibition. The current exhibition panels, accompanying materials and object collections are in the process of being edited and updated.



The BoD worked with the JLC, Mitzvah Day and the Jewish Volunteering Network to organise trauma informed training for members of the Jewish community hosting Ukrainian refugees.

Health and Mental Health - The London Jewish Health Partnership in conjunction with BoD has now been launched with the NHS and local public health in London.

Youth - The BoD is in the process of setting up a WhatsApp group of youth movement Deputies, U35 Deputies and Observers and movement leaders to focus on youth movement and young people's concerns.

Antisemitism - The BoD met Lionel Idan, the Chief Crown Prosecutor for South London. Idan apologised to the Jewish community for a number of incidents in which the Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) fell short in prosecuting antisemitic hate crimes. The BoD briefed Parliamentarians attending a Westminster Hall Debate on Antisemitism and Other Forms of Racism in Football.

The BoD met Mike Freer MP to discuss topics including BDS, proscription of terrorist groups, and Iraq's new antisemitic law. Mr Freer was receptive and affirmed that the Government was investigating what could be done about the Iraqi law.

The BoD met Steve Reed MP to discuss potential reforms to the Human Rights Act., and an extension of COVID-era provisions in the health system which benefited the Jewish community.

The BoD met with the Equality Commission of Northern Ireland to discuss whether legal action could be taken to secure access to kosher food for the local Jewish community.

Campus Affairs - The Board, working closely with the Higher Education Working Group, prepared a submission to the National Union of Students' investigation into its handling of antisemitism.

Religious Freedom - The BoD met the Finnish Ambassador to the UK, HE Jukka Siukosaari, to discuss proposed legislation in Finland that would ban Shechita.

The BoD met Miranda Grell, Acting Chief Executive of the Black Equity Organisation, to discuss health and medical policy issues and to share best practice.
