




#### **EDUCATION**

The month of Tishri sees the education and youth team's feet hardly touch the ground as we go from preparing and running one holiday activity after the other. Fortunately, we had pre-planned all our activities up until Chanukah so that took the stress off a bit. But as Sarah has mentioned in her article for Young Families it is just so heart-warming to see so many families join in and appreciate our activities, it makes our work so worthwhile and spurs us on to do more to connect with the nearly 500 young people we have in our community.

For me one of the highlights of our Sukkah decorating party this year was that we invited residents form Norwood Homes to the party. They had such a great time and I was told what the invite meant for them as it was the only the second time since lockdown that they had been out and to be invited to a synagogue was so special.

Besides all the festivals happening, normal life like Orot, B'nei Mitzvah Classes and All Things Jewish continue. In Orot the children wrote to King Charles to offer their condolences on the death of his mother, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth. You can see one of the touching letters that the children wrote.



Orot is welcoming our new shinshin (volunteer high school graduate from Israel) Shachar who will be spending once a month over the next year with the children to share with and teach them as much as she can in that time about Israel.

In our b'nei mitzvah classes this term, they are having lively debates about 'What is Torah' with their teachers, our rabbis. Our mentoring programme has restarted, which is really special and keeps our young people connected and involved way after their bar/bat mitzvah. I am sharing a message from one of our mentors to demonstrate the impact the programme has on her:

"Being part of the mentoring program has helped me to harness my passion for leadership and teaching. I love being able to be part of someone else's b'nei mitzvah experience. Being a familiar face in the congregation helps enable the student to perform with confidence, which as mentors we have watched develop throughout the term. I additionally feel that the mentoring program feels like our own little section of the community and has helped form many friendships."


