COMMUNITY CARE

Mental Health Shabbat takes place on 20/21 January and we are pleased to announce that we will be holding a one-hour online parallel service with Rabbi Judith Levitt, which will focus on mental health and Judaism and provide a safe space to support one another & have a discussion. During the main service, we will also be hearing an update from our EHRS Let's Talk Mental Health chair Michael Benjamin. Jami, the mental health service for the Jewish community, is currently running a one-year pilot scheme addressing the mental health needs of children and young people of secondary-school age, filling a vital gap between the growing numbers of young people struggling with their mental health and the lack of mental health services currently available to them. They plan to extend the service at the end of Spring 2023 when the pilot ends. Jami is also working with Qwell to provide adults with access to free, safe, online mental health and wellbeing support. Individuals can join immediately and anonymously through any smartphone, tablet or computer, to gain access to text based counselling which provides safe and confidential one-hour chat sessions with a fully qualified counsellor online via instant messaging. Online peer support provides moderated online forums offering advice and support from others with lived experience of mental health issues. Their self-help tools enable individuals to set and track their own goals to support their recovery or maintain their wellbeing. This new service also provides access to a confidential online journal and articles and content co-produced by other adults and experts by experience.

Two Generations is working closely with Harrow Council to assess and match host families with Ukrainian refugees. They currently have various individuals, as well as a couple with a 2 month old baby, who are desperate to get out of Ukraine and have no electricity or heating. They also have refugees already in the UK who require a host. Hosts must be living in the Borough of Harrow with a spare room they can offer an individual or perhaps this couple and are happy to share their facilities. They ask that hosts commit to a minimum of 6 months but shorter terms can be considered. The Homes for Ukraine scheme offers £350 per month thank-you payments to hosts, plus an additional £150 per month during the winter months to contribute towards energy bills. 

NAGILA

Nagila has had a busy few months. We started our new term in September and immediately began to learn about the High Holy Days. We introduced Rosh Hashanah by reading stories to the children during circle times, and enjoyed tasting apple dipped in honey. The older group learnt why we have a round challah on Rosh Hashanah, and created a fantastic story map based around a favourite Rosh Hashanah book. Rabbi Mark came to visit for a special Rosh Hashanah circle time. It was lovely listening to his stories and singing songs with him. He blew the shofar for us and all the children had a chance to try it (some more successfully than others!!) Whilst the EHRS Sukkah was being built outside, we constructed our own Nagila Sukkah with the children busy making decorations to hang up. We also created 3 very large fruit decorations for the EHRS Sukkah based round the 3 senses of 'smell', 'taste' and 'feel'. The children helped to bake two delicious Challahs for our special Nagila Kabbalat Shabbat in the EHRS Sukkah. They had to knead the dough for a very long time, and leave it to prove overnight before repeating the process all over again the next day. Finally, the children filled the Challahs with fruit and glazed the top of them with egg before baking them in the oven. To bring the celebrations to a close, Rabbi Mark met us in the synagogue and showed us all the beautiful scrolls, including the very special one in memory of Rabbi Kraft z'l.



We also spent time this term teaching the children about the wider community in which they live. In order to link the fireworks they had seen in the sky for Diwali and those that many of them saw in their own gardens for Firework night we learnt a little about Diwali. We showed them rangoli patterns, and we put together a tuff tray with coloured rice for the children to create their own patterns. Then following a



comprehensive risk assessment, we toasted marshmallows using a small disposable BBQ in the playground. The children (and their teachers) thoroughly enjoyed their 'smores', and understood how important it was to stay seated far away from the heated coals. It was a very tasty treat! We also introduced the children to the idea of Tzedakah as we took part in Just ONE Tree Day and also contributed to the EHRS Mitzvah Day by creating a fantastic banner to decorate the hall. We also made some lovely cards for the residents of Rosetrees, a Jewish Care home in Friern Barnet and the parents donated 'care kits' for the homeless, which the children presented to a representative of Homeless in Barnet during the morning.

We have also just had fun! We explored jelly, shaving foam, paint and corn flour (yes, we still use it, even if Tesco want to stop selling it!!) with our hands. We role played in our inviting home corner and we read lots of books and sang lots of songs! As the Early Years Foundation Stage for 0-5 years states - young children will be learning to use all their senses in hands-on exploration of materials, and that educator's should provide openended play materials.

7 members of EHRS marched under its banner for the annual AJEX parade at the Cenotaph on 20 November. 3 members of Finchley Progressive asked if they could join us and of course they were most welcome.



There were other members of EHRS marching under different banners e.g. JLGB and many others, in what was a well-attended event - long may that continue. The AJEX annual parade continues to be a major cross-communal event in the Jewish calendar. Whitehall is closed in recognition of the sacrifices made by Jews in the service of the crown.

Lining up in Horse Guards, quite a challenge for the marshals, we then marched down Whitehall to the Cenotaph. The service there included an address by the Chief Rabbi followed by wreath laying, prayers and military music.

The rain held off until nearly the end but getting a little wet was a small price to pay for what we were commemorating. As always it was a moving, but at the same time an enjoyable afternoon with a great feeling of solidarity and community not just with fellow Jews but with everyone in attendance, especially when the crowd sang Adom Olam, led or sometimes followed by the Band of the Irish Guards. A group of Jews singing in unison!?



It would be wonderful to see more people attending, particularly the younger generation. With fewer and fewer survivors from the war years still alive it is important to maintain this tradition. The continuation of the AJEX Annual Ceremony & Remembrance Parade at the Cenotaph is essential to remind both Jews and non-Jews of the vital role played by our community in British life.




Please find below a summary of the recent events from the Board of Deputies:

Community & Education Division

UK Education

To help educate non-Jewish school children and the wider public, the Jewish Living Experience Exhibition is being updated including the "What do Jewish people look like" banner which will show the ethnic diversity of Jews.



Health and Mental Health

The aim of this group is to set up the Health and Mental Health connection to the regions outside London and to communicate national issues and updates. Rabbi Mark Goldsmith, a trustee of EcoSynagogue, has joined the London Anchors Green New Deal working group which is focusing on air quality and active travel as well as retrofit. LJF are working on an Air Quality Information Seminar for the Jewish Community with the GLA.

International Division

The Board condemned the harassment of worshippers at the Western Wall's Egalitarian section in Jerusalem. The Board laid a wreath at a ceremony in Parliament to commemorate the Israeli Olympians murdered in Munich in 1972.

The recent new law in Iraq, which makes it punishable by death to associate with Zionists has caused great distress. The Board of Deputies has raised concerns with the Foreign Secretary and the Minister for Middle East's team and wrote an opinion piece in Newsweek ahead of US President Biden's meeting

The Board held an introductory meeting with Nuno Brito, Ambassador of Portugal to the UK, to discuss the interests of the Portuguese Jewish community. the history of Sephardic Jewry and commitments to fostering tolerant societies and combatting antisemitism.

Defence & Group Relations Division

Antisemitism

The Board participated in two meetings of the Metropolitan Police London Jewish Community Forum, co-ordinated by the London Jewish Forum. The Board met Mick Conboy, National Hate Crime Policy Lead at CPS to further discussions on tackling hate crime and to prepare for a presentation for the Hate Crime Coordinators Network. The Board addressed the Crown Prosecution Service's Hate Crime Co-ordinators Conference, providing insights into the community impact of antisemitism and hate crime. The Board met Lord Mann, Advisor to the Government on Antisemitism, to discuss the digital education project, the Crown Prosecution Service, the police's approach to hate crime and Government policy on antisemitism. The Board of Deputies, the Jewish Leadership Council, and the Community Security Trust issued a joint statement responding to the election of Naomi Wimborne-Idrissi to Labour's National Executive

Parliamentary Engagement

The Board attended Conservative Party Conference in Birmingham, and addressed the Conservative Friends of Israel reception, speaking about the need to proscribe Iranian terrorist organisation and the IRGC.

The Board met Michelle Donelan, Secretary of State for the Department of Culture Media and Sport, to share our views on the Online Safety Bill and to learn about potential changes to the proposed legislation to ensure its passage through Parliament.
