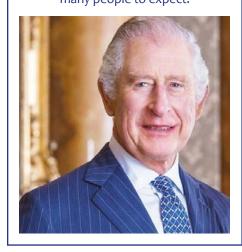

Scams - New digital ways of communicating have led to an increasing number of scams with more people being tricked by them. A scammer may try to approach you on your doorstep, by post, over the phone or online and they will often pretend to be someone they are not or will make misleading offers of services or investments. For those of you who have been affected, you will know that they can be very distressing and the impact is often emotional as well as financial. However, if you have been the victim of a scam, remember that you are not alone and there are ways to help avoid being taken in by a scam if you know what to look for. Age UK recently ran a 'Scams Awareness' bingo session at the EHRS monthly lunch club and have produced a guide which can help you spot the warning signs that someone might be trying to scam you. It explains the ways scammers might try to approach you, what you can do if you think you are being scammed and how to avoid being deceived by scams in the future. You can order any of their guides or factsheets by giving the **Age UK Advice Line** a ring for free on 0800 169 65 65 (8am-7pm, 365 days a year). Also visit their website www.ageuk.org.uk/scams where you will find a lot of useful information. If you are worried that you may have been scammed please also contact Val or Marissa in confidence to discuss what has happened.
