A TIME TO PAUSE



Pausing is a strange thing. It's not something that often happens in our hectic modern lives, so I am thoroughly grateful to have had the opportunity over the last 3 months to take a pause, a sabbatical. Though of course with children still in primary school pausing rarely means actually having extra time, but it has allowed time for other things. The last three years have been unlike anything any of us have lived through before, but for clergy (along with many other key workers) the amount we have held is unprecedented, and I think it took the first month of my sabbatical to just recover!

I have frequently been asked 'what are you doing with your sabbatical' and while there are of course things I've been working on (from my Hebrew to research) I have often felt pangs of guilt whenever faced with this question during my sabbatical. Resting seems inadequate as an answer, as does pausing. Inadequate because we are expected (or perhaps expect of ourselves) to be endlessly productive, always achieving something.

The idea of sabbatical comes from the Biblical concept of 'shmitta' - a seventh year of rest for the land of Israel. It is not expected to meet the endless production demands humans inevitably place on her, and this year of lying fallow allows the land to regenerate and continue to serve. Shabbat is rooted in similar ideas for us - a day not just of rest, but of shifted priorities, focusing on us not as consumers and producers, but as creatures with spiritual needs, and a need to just press pause, so that we can better serve in the other 6 days.

As we enter the High Holy Days, this period is another gift in Jewish time. It offers us a pause to reflect, to uncover the parts of ourselves that we don't have time for the rest of the year because, as we are meant to, we are getting on with living as well as we can (or doing another load of laundry). The month of Elul, followed by Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and Sukkot are all gifted to us as a package of time, that allows us permission to pause, reflect, recommit ourselves and then dive back into the physical world and living well.

I hope the pause offers us all an opportunity to recommit ourselves to that which will bring most meaning and joy to our lives, and at EHRS we can't wait to celebrate and walk that journey with you.

Elul

Elul is our month of preparation to get us ready for the spiritual work of the High Holy Days. This will include a Shabbat Shirah Friday Night Service, First Shabbat Shiur, HaKol B'Seder Service, Reverse Taschlich with EcoJudaism, and our special **Elul Masterclass Morning on Sunday 3 September, 10:00-12:30** which includes shofar blowing, soul candles, a honey cake cookalong, and a session on the meaning of forgiveness. Selichot Choral Service & Film: Saturday 9 September, 20:30-00:10

We will start the evening with the quirky Coen brother's film **'A Serious Man'** which was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Picture on its release in 2010. After a break for refreshments, at 23:00 we will begin our beautiful choral service led by our rabbis, Cantors & featuring the EHRS Choir and cellist, Sam Weinstein.

Erev Rosh Hashanah: Friday 15 September

We will begin with our Erev Rosh Hashanah Service, 19:30-20:40, and offer a study session Blasting Into The New Year, 20:00-20:30.

First Day Rosh Hashanah: Saturday 16 September

We will hold a Shacharit & Musaf (Additional) Service, at 10:00 followed by Kiddush. Running parallel we also have an Early Years Service, Chumash Babies, Primary Years Service, a Youth Service, and a Stay & Schmooze and Youth Tashlich. From 17:00-17:30 we will have our Tashlich in the Park in various local locations.

Second Day Rosh Hashanah: Sunday 17 September

Our morning Shacharit and Musaf Service will take place at 10:00 with a parallel study session Bite of Apple & Honey Torah Study at 11:15. We also have Create the Universe Family Service 10:00-11:00, and Create the Universe Youth Activities, 10:00-11:00.

The Ten Days

The days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are opportunities for us to prepare ourselves for the extraordinary experience that is Yom Kippur. This year we have a session about the new Machzor coming in 2024, Shabbat Shuvah services and a special Shabbat Club.

Kol Nidre: Sunday 24 September (Fast Begins 18:40)

Our Kol Nidre Service will begin at 19:30, and a Kol Nidre Service from the New Machzor running parallel. We will also have a study session on this evening, Believing, Belonging, Behaving? What Makes me a Jew?

Yom Kippur: Monday 25 September (Fast ends 19:39)

Throughout the day on Yom Kippur, you will have the choice of our classic services such as Shacharit, Musaf, Minchah, Yizkor and Neilah, as well as a variety of parallel adult study sessions such as Yom Kippur B'Bayit, Neshamah Avodah, No Beer Still a Shiur and Talmud study session. We also have many young children and youth services on offer. The day will end with Havdallah, and the opportunity to break the fast together as a community.



A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

I grew up as a child in Dollis Hill, North West London. My family were members of Dollis Hill United Synagogue and were what most of us would call typical North West London Jews. Shul on a Shabbat morning, Grandstand and football in the afternoon. Friday night was, well Friday night. Lighting candles, Kiddush, family dinner and then the BBC for, what is now, a classic comedy programme (probably now banned for general viewing).

Rosh Hashanah was always different. Candles and Kiddush at home followed by apple and honey. Shul followed by no TV. Shul on first day at 8am, but not to finish until 2pm. Big family lunch followed by Taschlich. Second day would be a repeat of the first day and no TV on until Yom Tov went out at what seemed like some ridiculous late hour.

Kol Nidre would be even more stringent. Big meal before shul then bed when we got home, a tradition I still keep today! Up late and then off to shul for Yom Kippur, concluding with the shofar blast, and then home for something to eat. One of life's biggest decisions to make on an annual basis. Piece of Challah? Fish ball? Herring? Drink? I can't say that I always break my fast on something specific, though it's always a milk meal so I can have that cup of tea!

So why do I bore you with this? These are all memories that come from traditions from my own family and household. I have tried to encourage my family now to make their own traditions and do things their way. High Holy Days are full of memories, family members no longer here and long forgotten traditions replaced by new ones. There is nothing wrong with that.

Moving to a Reform shul in the mid 1980's means that my traditions have actually not changed that much but the service meanings have. In my youth, the High Holy Days were all about saying as many words as possible in a language I did not really understand although I could read it. Since becoming a Reform Jew I now read the prayers with more meaning and many a time during a service I will find myself looking through our Machzor, reading different study passages making the day different. I am already looking forward to next year's new Machzor for which our own Rabbi Mark is the Chair of the editorial group.

Our services are tuneful and meaningful, plus it's wonderful to see people who we haven't seen for a long time. Do try and come this year and experience our wonderful Rabbinic team. The services wouldn't be possible without, and in no order, the Choir, Stewards, Security, Office Team, Tech Team, Wardens, Caretaking Team, Youth & Education Team, those in Marketing, and Community Support. If I've missed anyone out, I apologise. Everyone at EHRS cares about the shul and our members, and without our members we would have nothing to organise, so thank you.

I am coming to the end of my first year as Chair. It has been a fantastic experience and I'd like to thank my fellow Honorary Officers and Council members for their help and support. We all love serving our community.

Together we are part of the global Jewish waterfront clean up (www.repairthesea.org/rt2023). Our Rabbis and the EHRS Environment Action Team invite all generations to join us to make a difference. The children had the opportunity to get up and personal with a donkey named Tom, sheep, goats, pigs, rabbits and a guinea pig. We also had a gorgeous golden Labrador named Gunter who was the star of the show. Crystal from Ark Farm sat the children down and explained to them how to look after the animals and how to touch them. She told us that the animals do not like to be touched on their tails, legs or faces, and that we could stroke their backs and heads. Gunter the dog liked to have his tummy tickled. Every child was extremely well behaved and had a lovely morning. The EYFS states that "young children are beginning to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things, and that adults should help children to care for animals and take part in first hand experiences."

In order to continue the important tradition of giving to charity and help teach our children that their actions, no matter how small, can make a real difference, we have participated in a variety of 'charity days' each term. This term we joined in Pyjamarama Day! Pyjamarama is all about having the best reading day ever, in PJs, to raise vital funds for the Book Trust, to reach more children with the life-long and magical benefits of reading. We made some very colourful bunting, which is hung up in the hallway. We also created a large pair of pyjamas, which we displayed by the book corner. It was so lovely to see so many of the children and staff come in dressed in their pyjamas! We had a fabulous morning with a scavenger hunt, listening to some stories upstairs in the sensory room, and Rabbi Mark came for a visit too! He read some books to the children: luckily, they were not bedtime stories, as I am sure some of us may have fallen asleep dressed in our PJ's! In the last few weeks of term, our caterpillars arrived at Nagila, and we made a special area for them to grow. The children were fascinated with how quickly they changed each day. The EYFS states, "Young children will be learning to understand the key features of the life cycle of a plant and an animal." The children enjoyed the story of the "Hungry Caterpillar,"



and created a lovely caterpillar out of paper plates. Once they had completed their life cycle and turned into butterflies, we released them in our garden.

During the summer holidays we enjoyed three weeks of 'fun in the sun' with our summer play scheme where we welcomed both Nagila children and children from other nurseries. We were sad to see many of our children leave to move on to 'big school'. But we consoled ourselves with the knowledge that their time at Nagila had helped them to become confident, independent, self-assured individuals with a strong sense of their community, enabling them to move onto the next stage of their academic journey with aplomb!!
