#### Misconnected Drains - Don't risk a fine!

It might seem like a long way away, but our annual Reverse Tashlich event will take place in early October. As well as thinking about what we can take out of our water, it is worth considering what we put into it and how that affects the health of our waterways.



I was speaking to Mustafa Field of the Faith Forum for London at our Interfaith Iftar last week and it struck me how fundamentally interfaith any sort of environmental action is. Litter, air pollution, and contaminated water are bad for everyone and don't discriminate on religious grounds.

Whilst a lot of these problems are systemic and should be dealt with by policymakers, there are some quite significant things that individuals can do.

As part of my voluntary work with the Riverfly Partnership (www.riverflies.org), I undertook a recent survey of the water in the Burnt Oak Brook which goes through Watling Park and on to Edgware, eventually connecting to the Brent and then the Thames. We check the population of various water creatures including mayfly larvae, water beetles and other small critters. Unlike fish, these animals cannot move away from pollution incidents so if the water is poor, they cannot thrive.

At the end of the survey, we have a score which indicates the health of the water. It goes without saying that the Burnt Oak Brook is in a poor state. Major contributors to this are road run off, illegal dumping and misconnected drainage.

The Riverfly Partnership has recruited some local volunteers to monitor the outfalls from rainwater drains and this, in combination with the river fly surveys, means that we can now assist the Environmental Agency in pinpointing those homes and businesses that are discharging sewage directly into the streams, and hit the owners with a fine of up to £50,000 under the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

It seems impossible to imagine that we have now passed the 6th month mark since full scale war once again broke out between Israel and Gaza. I am not sure I will ever forget standing on the bimah, opening the Simchat Torah Service, trying to juggle the simchah of the day, with the still emerging news. In the week that followed we began to absorb the full horror of what had happened, and the devastation left for our own community's families. The next Shabbat we shared the important responsibility of trying to celebrate a Bar Mitzvah, and hold the grief we had all sat with through the week. From the bimah I can say that probably two thirds of the congregation cried at any given time during that service. We needed to come together. Many of us have cried since at the suffering we see in Israel and in Gaza, and

we continue to pray for an end to not just this war and the return of the hostages, but for a permanent solution that allows all to thrive together.

I have been involved in interfaith dialogue around Israel and Palestine for 20 years, and for at least 10 have had a policy of not posting on social media about the conflict, especially in times of conflict, but instead inviting conversations in person. There have been many many conversations since October 7th, and there has also been a lot of silence. Sometimes I was surprised by who wanted to engage in the difficult conversations. At others I was heartbroken by the breaking down of long held relationships. One of the things I started to do on social media instead of writing directly about the pain I was in, or the fear of what was unfolding, was to try and post a 'candle' every day - a small glimmer of something positive, whether it be the Muslim and Jewish owners of a kosher restaurant celebrating a birthday together (and giving us all cake) or something kind one of my kids did. One day it was a line of ducks that crossed the road on my drive down to our beautiful Woodland Cemetery.

One of the brightest candles I've experienced since October was an interfaith Iftar we were able to host in March, in partnership with Faiths Forum for London. 100 people gathered together, evenly split between members and guests. Members invited their neighbours, old interfaith friends came, including a group from the Uigher community who we supported in our Pesach programming over the last few years. One Muslim gentleman saw the Iftar mentioned in a Times article and drove 50 miles to be with us as he thought it was so brave and hopeful.

We didn't ignore the conflict, who could? But we also remembered so many other points of connection and discussion. An amazing gang of EHRS volunteers helped us cook, and I was deeply moved to hear our Muslim friends and colleagues offer their prayers on breaking their fast. We haven't changed the world, but we did light a candle together, and while we heard each other's stories, we created space for us to continue in conversation together.

Our newly re-formed interfaith committee is hoping to ensure this work remains core to us at EHRS, and we would love to hear from you if you'd like to get more involved in this work. In the meantime, as a community, we continue to try and light candles for each other.

# Sobeslav Scroll 1211

Sobeslav Scroll 1211 (Cz 57071) is one of the 1564 Czech Scrolls that were saved in Prague during World War 2. On long term loan from the Memorial Scrolls Trust to Edgware & Hendon Reform Synagogue, it was originally allocated to Polack's House, Clifton College, Bristol in May 1971. The MST records show that it probably was written around 1900. It was retrieved from Clifton College in 2008, having been found not to have been in use for some time. Hendon Reform Synagogue had originally been allocated Scroll 1457 and Rabbi Arthur Katz had been led to believe by Rabbi Harold Reinhart that it was specially chosen because it was said to have come from the town of Sobeslav where Rabbi Katz had been its last rabbi. In fact, the records revealed in around 2005 that Rabbi Reinhart had been mistaken and that Scroll 1457 had actually been received from the town of Tabor, which is near Sobeslav. The error was discovered long after the death of Rabbi Arthur Katz, by which time his son Rabbi Steven Katz had taken over from his father as the rabbi at Hendon Reform Synagogue.

As the research director of the Memorial Scrolls Trust, I was aware of this case of mistaken identity and when, by chance, Scroll 1211 was returned from Clifton College I proposed to rectify the error by offering it to Rabbi Katz in exchange for the Tabor Scroll.

Thus, the gesture that Rabbi Reinhart had intended would be made good.

The exchange was made on 26 March 2008 on condition that Hendon Reform Synagogue would arrange for a sofer to examine Scroll 1211 and carry out any refurbishment that was necessary. The scroll was examined by Sofer Stam Bernard Benarroch who carried out the necessary work that year. When Hendon Synagogue merged with Edgware Reform Synagogue to form Edgware and Hendon Reform Synagogue in 2017, Scroll 1211 from Sobeslav was brought to the Edgware Synagogue and the Memorial Scroll from Golcuv Jenikov that had originally been allocated to Edgware Reform Synagogue was returned to the Memorial Scrolls Trust and allocated to a new congregation.

In 2023, EHRS decided to explore the bond with the lost congregation of Sobeslav and Rabbi Tanya held the first meeting with interested members of the congregation on 7 October, which will go down in history as the day of the massacre by Hamas. The first task was to obtain the Sobeslav Transport List of over 120 names of the Jews who were deported to their deaths on 16 November 1942. This May sees a group of EHRS members visiting Prague Sobeslav, and Terezin, to find out more about this lost community, and to start to build valuable connections in order to continue this vital research.

A group from EHRS went to The Westminster Synagogue in December 2023 to see the exhibition at the Memorial Scrolls Trust, and Rabbi Tanya brought EHRS's Sobeslav Scroll to Westminster Synagogue on 4 February 2024 to take part in the 60th Anniversary Celebration Synagogue of the arrival of the 1564 Czech Scrolls from Prague in 1964.

There are eleven other Sobeslav Scrolls with other congregations, and these are all in the USA. What all 12 congregations have in common is the responsibility which comes with being entrusted with a Memorial Scroll, and that is to honour and remember as individuals the Jews of their lost congregation, as we ourselves would wish to be remembered, and to save them from the Anonymity of the Six Million.

#### **NAGILA**

We have had a busy few months since the start of the year. With the cold weather in January we learnt about how birds and wildlife need extra help finding food in the winter. The children decorated bird feeders made from cut out milk cartons. They also helped prepare the bird food by mixing the seeds with softened margarine and then putting in in the bird feeders.

We celebrated Tu B'Shevat with lots of different activities. The children helped to create a very big tree using different media including twigs, bark and tissue paper. This was used as a display for the EHRS Tu B'Shevat Seder. Rabbi Tanya visited and spoke about the festival and was joined by some members of the EHRS Eco Team, who showed the children how to make bird feeders using pinecones. The children had fun planting a bay leaf and an Apple tree for our playground, using their hands to surround the roots of the trees with soil.

Part of our curriculum is designed to help the children learn about the wider community. This is best achieved by real life experiences, so for Chinese New Year



we set up a Chinese restaurant in the home corner where the children spent time playing and dressing up in traditional Chinese costumes and learning about the customs associated with the Chinese New Year.

As part of a regular occurrence the children delighted some of the Synagogue's more senior members at their Monthly Lunch Club by entertaining them with some singing and a meet and greet!! We hope to do this on a more regular basis. There are many benefits to this kind of intergenerational activities for both the children and adults such as social interaction which can help make massive improvements in mental health,

helping to battle depression, loneliness, and dementia. Also the children in particular tend to develop stronger communication and social skills, develop language and reading, and increase their confidence and self-esteem.

In preparation for Purim the children all made their own Rashanim (shakers) to take home, and they all got to choose what to fill their shaker with to make lots of noise. We also filled and shaped Hamantaschen and covered them with sprinkles ready to be baked and eaten at our Purim party. We made so many that we were able to share them with the Night Shelter guests! We celebrated Purim with a wonderful party, and Cantor Tamara joined us to judge our costumes and lead us on a parade into the Beit Tefillah to see the Megillah Esther scroll.

We ended the term with our very own Seder led by Rabbi Debbie.

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
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
